


RATIONALE/NEED

- Nearly 18% of children in NC and 22% of children in Pitt County live in poverty.
- Screening for SDoH has been shown
- WE CARE represents an innovative step towards acknowledging patient's unmet social needs and connecting them with local resources.
- The overall aim of this project is to improve accessibility of resources to our patients within the ECU Pediatric Outpatient Clinic




METHODS

- Families with children between the ages of 2 months and 10 years were screened for SDoH during their child's well visit at the ECU Pediatric Outpatient Clinic utilizing the WE CARE Screener.
- The WE CARE identifies unmet needs in 6 areas: education, employment, food security, housing, childcare, and utilities.
- Utilizing NCCare360, a statewide online coordinated care network, a family resource book was created to refer families to community resources.
- 80 families were enrolled in the intervention arm of trial to assess whether their connection with resources was sustained
