Course Description	The Acting Internship (AI) is a comprehensive clinical experience designed to provide the student with increased responsibilities for the assessment and management of geriatric patients. Students are integrated into the health care team and will have primary responsibility for the patient's care under close supervision. The Acting Intern will experience the roles and responsibilities of an intern on the team. This AI will provide students the opportunity to obtain the needed knowledge, skills, and attitudes that will result in successful care of older patients.

Course Activities	Students will participate in the day-to-day management of patients in ambulatory, nursing home, home care visits, and hospice settings. Time will also be spent attending multidisciplinary patient care conferences, participating in teaching and wound care rounds, and working with outpatient individuals in the Geriatric Center.
