Evaluate and critique the major public health and medical systems of the specific region using information gathered from local public health and medical systems experts Develop a global public health initiative on a specific public health and/or medical issue for the local and/or broader geographic area. 				
Course Activities	Students will learn about the sociocultural, historical and policy issues related to the specific international location through online lectures via Webcast and Podcast, and independent readings and assignments. Additionally, students will interact with course directors and other students through online discussion board assignments. Students will travel internationally to complete fieldwork, interacting with and learning from experts and institutions for a period of 7 days.
