Course Activities		Students will participate in daily clinics at the Vidant Cancer Center outpatient clinic. They are encouraged to attend conferences including: breast cancer conference, journal club, patient care conference, thoracic oncology conference, hematopathology conference, melanoma conference and Hematology/Oncology fellow didactic conferences. Students in this course will receive verbal feedback at the mid-point of the rotation to allow opportunity for performance improvement.
