Brief Course Description	To experience a wide range of surgical conditions at a rural site and the coordination between surgeons and primary care physicians. This experience may be particularly useful to understand the role of a surgeon in a community setting. Students will be expected to participate all aspects of surgical rural care including preoperative evaluation, surgical management, inpatient postoperative care, and outpatient follow-up.
Educational Objectives (at least 3)	By the end of this course, a student will: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Demonstrate the ability to identify and describe common surgical conditions.2. Demonstrate the ability to perform a focused history and physical exam on a potential surgical patient.3. Demonstrate the ability to develop an appropriate differential diagnosis, evaluation plan, and pre-operative preparation for potential surgical patients.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Demonstrate the ability to identify an acute abdomen, formulate an appropriate differential diagnosis, and management plan. 5. Discuss the utility of laboratory and radiographic studies in the evaluation of common surgical problems. 6. Describe the challenges of surgery in a rural setting in respect to workup, management, and tertiary care referral. 7. Demonstrate basic surgical skills including knot tying, suturing, and suture/staple removal. 8. Describe the need for surgeons in general and rural practice. 9. Describe the indications for a surgical consult and the importance of communication between surgeons and primary care physicians in the community setting. 10. Demonstrate a professional work ethic and demeanor, including collaborative interactions with other healthcare team members 11. Communicate effectively with patients, families and other care providers including respecting cultural and socioeconomic differences
