Course Description	The Canopy Medical Spanish elective will enable students to work on bridging the gap between providers and their limited-English proficient (LEP) patients. The two-week elective involves the completion of the Canopy Medical Spanish program online curriculum, guided via their course director in the BSOM Office of Diversity Affairs. The course teaches specialized medical concepts and terminology across a wide spectrum of commonly encountered clinical scenarios to enable providers to increase their confidence in conversational skills in medical Spanish. This 40-hour self- paced program culminates in the receipt of a Certificate in Medical Spanish. Completion of the program does not qualify you to act as an interpreter, but instead, the program's primary goal is to improve your cross-cultural communication skills. Prior knowledge of Spanish is not required by the program, but some familiarity with the language is preferred. Native speakers also are welcome, as the program can enhance medicine-specific language skills.

Course Activities	 Initial meeting with Course director at beginning of block Self-paced progression through the online Canopy Medical Spanish program The program has 3 levels, with 31 total unit quizzes and an exam at the er of each level Moving forward to the next level is contingent on successful passing of privilevel Completion of the program takes an average of 40 hours, but additional time may be needed if remediation of specific units is needed to pass each level exam Students who pass all 3 levels and complete the program earn a Certificat in Medical Spanish from the Canopy Program Adequate progression through the program and final completion is verified by the course director
