- •The Greenville Community Shelter Clinic (GCSC) is a clinic that provides free primary care services
- •Located inside the Community Crossroads Center, the homeless shelter that serves Greenville, GCSC primarily serves homeless patients, although all patients are welcome




## VAXXED & BOOSTED

- •West Greenville, where GCSC is located, is historically of lower socioeconomic status, leading to poorer social determinants of health
- •Pitt County is ranked 48<sup>th</sup> out of the 100 counties for COVID vaccination rates, with only 53.8% of the population vaccinated<sup>1</sup>
- •VAXXED & BOOSTED is a grassroots vaccination campaign that utilized community members as ambassadors to encourage others to get vaccinated for COVID





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### "Now What?"

#### Medical Respite

- •In 2018-2019, 3600 people in Greenville experienced homelessness<sup>2</sup>
- •40% of the CCC residents have been hospitalized while homeless

A medical respite is "acute and postacute care for persons experiencing homelessness who are too ill or frail to recover from a physical illness or injury on the streets but are not ill enough to be in a hospital"<sup>3</sup>

- •Medical respites offer:
  - -Shelter
  - Access to social workers
  - -24/7 on call caregivers
  - -Food
  - -Transportation to and from medical appointments
- •Homeless people are more likely to spend longer in the hospital
- •Homeless people spend, on average, 3 nights in the hospital per visit, which can cost upwards of \$9,000<sup>4</sup>
- •Medical respites cost an average of \$125 to \$325 per night<sup>5</sup>
- •Medical respite care reduces hospital readmission and ED recidivism<sup>6</sup>
