-Course Location	ECU Health Medical Center, ECU Health Cancer Center
Course Description	<p>This fourth-year acting internship block is a comprehensive clinical experience designed to provide the student with increased responsibilities for the assessment and management of patients within the Department of Gynecologic Oncology. It is designed for student interested in pursuing or considering a residency in OBGYN. Students are integrated into the health care team and will have responsibility for the patient's care under close supervision. The Acting Intern will experience the roles and responsibilities of a first year resident on the team. This AI will provide students an opportunity to participate in a full range of services provided by a gynecologic oncologist, including inpatient rounds, clinic, surgery, and inpatient consultation. Specifically, students will participate in radical pelvic surgeries, familiarize themselves with common chemotherapy treatments of gynecologic malignancy, and attend tumor board/departmental conferences. An informal short scientific presentation is required at the end of the clerkship</p>
Educational Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the rationale for patient diagnoses and plans. • Establish and build upon a foundation of knowledge of common gynecologic cancer diagnoses and treatment options. • Perform evaluations, screenings and diagnostic tests, and identify management options (both medical and surgical) for gynecologic oncology problems. • Describe and discuss surgical anatomy and its relation to clinical

	<p>findings and procedures.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhance proficiency by completing physical examinations and clinical testing relevant to gynecology oncology. • Develop and execute a 30-minute presentation on a topic in gynecologic oncology.
Course Activities	<p>Students in this course will complete morning rounds with the team and will be assigned to cover surgical cases or be in oncology clinic based on the student's areas of interest. Participation in Grand Rounds and academic conferences is encouraged. Students will also cover inpatient consultation services. Students will be under the direct supervision of the Chief Resident in Gynecology Oncology and working with three attending Gynecologic Oncologist.</p>
Required Readings	<p>Students are encouraged to read from Berek and Hacker's, Clinical Gynecology Oncology, Williams Gynecology, Te Linde's Operative Gynecology, ACOG bulletins, and supporting materials online.</p>
Course Assessment	<p>Preceptor(s) will complete the M4 evaluation (final grade form) at the completion of the rotation.</p>
Schedule Requirements	<p>Student is present during inpatient hours, Monday Friday 6am to 5pm, (excluding holidays as determined by the ECU calendar). One full weekend required per 4-week block, which may be broken up into two 6-day work weeks.</p>
