

# **PROJECT AIM**


- Evaluate clinical teams' perceptions, readiness, and experiences towards patient depression screening within a multi-site rural cancer care system
- Inform a clinical workflow for depression screening


### **PROJECT DESIGN/STRATEGY**


Survey patient- facing members of the oncology care team at ECU Health Greenville and regional cancer clinics regarding their opinions and perceived barriers to depression screening

• Although most oncology care team members at ECU Health do not currently perform depression screening, most team members recognize the importance of depression screening.

Team members identified lack of time and confidence in their skills communicating about depression as potential barriers to screening implementation.

 Physicians were most often identified as appropriate individuals to perform screening. Care team member education and training represents an opportunity for growth for implementation of depression screening for oncology patients in the ECU

 Institute training opportunities focused on depression screening to facilitate program implementation Develop a clinical workflow for depression screening.
